THE WRITE STUFF

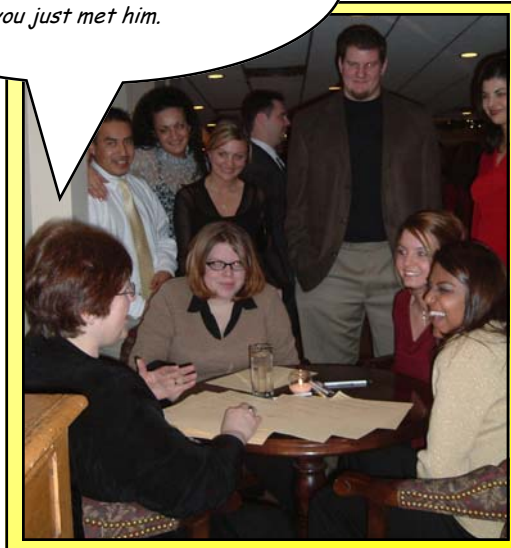
